Composer's Note

Prime is a high-energy work; a large machine, set up and let to run, constructed with many rules yet simultaneously having great internal freedom. Just about everything from harmony to the rhythmic cells is built upon the workings of the first 6 prime numbers (1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 11). *Prime* goes through one complete 'cycle' and ends where it began, slightly transfigured. I aimed to find musical meaning in a system governed by pre-determined structures.

The idea that each individual part is somewhat meaningless without the whole, and the whole is inextricably a sum of all the individual parts, is a central idea in *Prime* as many lines merge together to form larger-level lines and form a coherent musical texture.
